Ingoldisthorpe Village Hall Committee

Funds are requested towards the cost of improving access to the hall, by adding accessibility ramps and railings to three entrances to the building and adding a cellular grid matting surface under the shingle in the car park so that those with wheelchairs / pushchairs can more easily cross it.

The hall appears well used by the community, current activities include exercise classes, carpet bowls, crafts, coffee mornings, WI meetings, children's parties and charity events as well as providing the green for the Coach & Horses bowling club. The group has been undertaking a programme of improvements, which to date have included a new heating system and redecoration.

Individuals in the village have complained about hall access in person to Village Hall Committee members and on the Village Facebook page. Some members of the WI have felt unable to attend meetings due to the access issues, and parents with prams cannot push them through the loose shingle to reach the entrances.

The works will cost £26,910 in total.

Decision: To award £8,970.00 to be released when the project has secured the overall required funding and is in a position to proceed.
