It is aimed at increasing the supply of housing predominantly, although it also looks at more flexibility for agricultural uses, and increasing agricultural and industrial/business permitted development rights. It consists of 88 questions. Further details are included within the Member Briefing of 18 September (attached).

It should be noted that the latter part of the consultation is carried out jointly with DEFRA, and some of those questions have not been replied to, because they are aimed at the practical experience of farmers and land managers.
