# FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE COMMUNITY CAPITAL GRANTS

## Summary

This report details the decisions made in relation to the first round of Financial Assistance Community Capital Grants for 2011/12.

## Recommendation

It is recommended that the following grant decisions are approved: 1<sup>st</sup> Terrington Scout Group – Award £1,278 Gayton Parish Council – Award £15,000 London Road Methodist Church – Award £1,576 (conditional) Terrington St John Pre-school – Award £342 West Norfolk Riding for the Disabled – Award £13,700 (conditional) Wootton Scouts & Guide Hall Management Committee – Award £1,800 South West Norfolk Youth Opportunities Project - Refuse

## **Reason for Decision**

Determination of applications under the Financial Assistance scheme.

A grants panel meeting was held on 11 April 2011 to assess applications for capital grants which fall within the Community Portfolio. This report details the recommendations made at this meeting by the Portfolio Holder.

When the grant decision becomes official the applicants will be notified in writing by Norfolk Community Foundation on behalf of the Borough Council. All terms and conditions of the grants will be stated in the official offer letter.

## Grants over £2,500

**Gayton Parish Council** – Following extensive consultation with local residents, plans have been developed to transform Gayton Park into a social and play area for the community, comprising space for sports (football, basketball), plus a range of play equipment (climbing combination, zip wire, ropes). Seating will also be provided to encourage social and recreational use of the area for all ages. The project particularly aims to benefit the 8-12, and over 12s, age groups as local provision is recognised as limited.

Plans will cost £50,000 in total (excluding VAT, which is recoverable), of which the majority will be covered by a £30,000 grant awarded by WREN. The Parish Council has contributed £5,000 from its own reserves, and has also covered the third party funding requirement. The Parish Council is committed to the long term maintenance of the site, and will set aside funds to enable regular independent inspections and repairs/ improvements. £15,000 is requested from the Borough, which represents just under one third of total capital costs.

### Request: £15,000 Recommendation: Award £15,000

**West Norfolk Riding for the Disabled** – Funds are requested towards the repair and development of the centre, including replacing the toilet cabin block with portakabins for new toilets, store area and kitchen. The stables area will also be extended to create 2 new stables, a rug room, tack room and staff room. A space for teaching/ training will also be created, enabling formal accredited learning opportunities to be offered. This extensive development is needed as the organisation has doubled in size, and now offers riding opportunities to over 100 people per week, with over 70 volunteers.

The total cost of these works is £41,228 including VAT which is nonrecoverable. £13,500 of this sum has been donated by the owner of Wallington Hall, who hosts the centre on the estate. A further £10,000 grant has been secured, and a decision is awaited on a bid for £4,000 from a local trust. £13,700 (a third of costs) is requested from the Borough. A grant award should be offered on the condition that evidence is provided of full planning permissions.
