### Financial Assistance Small Grants Scheme

#### Summary

This report details the decisions made in relation to the second round of capital and revenue grant awards for 2015-16 and allocates funding for the Queen's 90<sup>th</sup> birthday celebrations from the revenue 'theme' budget for 2016/17.

#### Recommendation

#### Reason for Decision

Determination of applications under the Financial Assistance Fund.

A grants panel meeting was held on 12<sup>th</sup> April to assess applications for capital and revenue grants which fall within the Culture, Heritage and Health Portfolio. This report details the recommendations made at this meeting by the Portfolio Holder.
