Recording of Parish Council Meetings

The position with regard to the recording of Parish Council meetings by members of the public or a councillor without the knowledge or consent of the Parish Council. The starting point for this would be the Parish Council's constitution which may address this issue. In the Borough Council's Constitution it says:-

"36.1 Any person wishing to broadcast or record a Meeting should seek the permission of the chair and vice chair of that meeting."

There may be a similar provision in the Parish Councils' Constitution covering this issue.

Both the Office of Surveillance Commissioners Office and Information Commissioners' Office are not interested in the recording of meetings by members of the public or Councillors. The OSC say that the recording and playback of conversations at Council meetings or phone conversations by private individuals are outside the terms of the Regulation of Investigatory Powers Act 2000 (Directed Surveillance.) The Act only applies to Public Authorities (Borough Council) carrying out the directed surveillance.

The ICO are not concerned over this issue as they are of the opinion that there is a limited expectation of privacy at a public meeting.

The following legislation may be useful contained in the Public Bodies (Admission to Meetings) Act 1960

Section 1(7) that...nothing is this section shall require a body to permit the taking of photographs of any proceedings, or the use of any means to enable persons not present to see or hear any proceedings (whether at the time or later) or the making of any oral report on any proceedings as they take place."
