5. UPDATE FROM THE LICENSING MANAGER

The Licensing Manager updated the Board on the following changes to legislation and procedures:

- With regards to personal licences, these were currently issued for a ten year period, however in the future these would be issued permanently. In response to a question from Councillor Loveless, the Licensing Manager explained that the only time that a personal licence would be reviewed would be before the Courts if they were convicted of a relevant offence. The only time the Licensing Department would see a personal license would be on the initial application, which would be referred to the police if required and then considered by the Licensing Sub-Committee.
- From 1st January 2016 the current restriction on Temporary Event Licences would be lifted so that 15 could be held per calendar year.
- The Live Music Act had been relaxed further . and is extended to allow 500 people to attend before a licence was required. Previously the audience capacity had been limited to 200 people.
- From the 6th April 2015 there has been further deregulation of when regulated entertainment needs to be licensed. For instances entertainment held on Council own land would not need licensing provided certain conditions were met. Full details will be circulated by the Licensing Manager.
