	Reason for Decision In December 2012, the Borough Council and NWES have entered into a strategic partnership to deliver the King's Lynn

Enterprise and Innovation Centre (KLIC) and strengthen the provision of enterprise, business support and advice for start-ups and SMEs in West Norfolk. A key component of this strategic partnering is council representation to the NWES Board, which has been captured in the Partnership Agreement approved by Cabinet in December 2012.
