RECORD OF DECISION TAKEN UNDER DELEGATED POWERS

This is a record of a decision taken by the officers under delegated powers and where necessary taken in consultation with members and officers.

Delegated Power

Cabinet: 1 August 2017
Minute CAB41(4):

Delegated authority is given to the Council's s151 Officer, in consultation with the Leader of the Council, to agree any Non Domestic Rate Relief schemes where the eligibility criteria are specified by Central Government and the cost is met in full by Central Government through a Grant.

Decision Taken

To extend the Non Domestic Rates Discretionary Rural Rate Relief available in 2017/2018 into 2018/2019.

Reasons for the Decision

The Autumn Statement 2016 confirmed that Central Government intends to double the amount of Mandatory Rural Rate Relief from 50% to 100% from 1 April 2017. This requires primary legislation and until this is passed government have asked billing authorities to award the increase as Discretionary Rural Rate Relief. Government are fully compensating billing authorities for the cost of doing so.

The Council's Discretionary Rural Rate Relief scheme 2017/2018 was agreed by Council on 21 September 2017. Unfortunately the primary legislation will not be passed in time for the 2018/2019 financial year so billing authorities have been asked to continue awarding the relief under their discretionary powers. The cost of the discretionary relief in 2017/2018 is £64,766, and the estimated cost for 2018/2019 is £68,262. Funding will be paid on the same basis as the 2017/2018 scheme and the cost will be met in full by Central Government.

As the eligibility criteria are set by Central Government, and the cost is met in full, this extension can be agreed under delegated powers.
