#### **Financial Assistance Small Grants Scheme**

#### **Summary**

This report details the decisions made in relation to the first round of grants awarded through the Open Spaces Fund.

#### Recommendation

To approve the decisions set out below.

#### **Reason for Decision**

Determination of applications under the Open Spaces Fund.

In March 2019 the Borough Council received funds from the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government to enhance the green space available to their communities.

Part of this fund was used to open a small grants scheme, to be used to transform outdoor community spaces in the borough, and encourage greater use by local people.

Norfolk Community Foundation administer the scheme, as they do for the Council's Financial Assistance Scheme. Grants of up to £750 have been made available to support community projects that meet the following outcomes:

- Increased involvement from people who face barriers to participation in community life
- Healthier and safer lifestyles
- Greater use of community outdoor spaces

Applications are welcome from charities, church groups, parish or town councils, social enterprises or community interest companies and voluntary and community groups.

A grants panel meeting was held on 30 September to assess applications for the Open Spaces Fund, which falls within the Culture, Heritage and Health Portfolio. This report details the recommendations made at this meeting by the Portfolio Holder.

The recommendations featured in this report are subject to the 'call in' procedure. When the grant decision becomes official the applicants will be notified in writing by the Norfolk Community Foundation on behalf of the Borough Council. All terms and conditions of the grants will be stated in the official offer letter.
