Awards over £5,000:

St Faith's Church Local Ecumenical Partnership

A grant is requested by St Faith's LEP to re-purpose an existing bungalow in to a new community space, available for hire at a reduced rate to charities and groups in the community. It is understood that, whilst other community facilities do exist in Gaywood, they do not currently offer the kind of space needed for the specific activities of some groups, particularly private consultation rooms. Norfolk and Waveney Mind will be one of the main users.

The proposed new space will repurpose a bungalow owned by St Faith's on Gayton Road, and equip it with a modern, accessible café space, parish office and private consultation rooms. The plans are extensive and the bungalow will be completely remodelled to achieve this, with internal walls being moved and floors/ceilings overhauled to create the new spaces, and with areas of disrepair being upgraded or repaired (e.g. loft space, windows, doors, flooring, gutters and drains, plumbing system, electricals, insulation).

£10,000 is requested toward a total cost of £167,792 - £70,275 has already been raised.

Decision: To award £10,000.00 on the condition that the full funding needed to proceed is secured.
