# RECORD OF DECISION TAKEN UNDER DELEGATED POWERS

This is a record of a decision taken by the officers under delegated powers and where necessary taken in consultation with members and officers.

#### **Delegated Power**

Cabinet: 17 November 2020

Para 13:

That authority be delegated to the Revenues and Benefits Manager, in consultation with the s151 Officer and Council Leader, to decide the discretionary criteria for government Covid-19 support schemes and discounts where they:

- Are part of a central government Covid-19 support initiative,
- Are funded by central government, and
- Will be administered by the Revenues and Benefits section

#### **Decision Taken**

Creation of the policy for Phase 5 of the Additional Restrictions Grant (ARG) announced by government as part of the Nation Lockdown response in November 2020.

Phase 5 includes provision to provide wider business support initiatives including allocation of £665,000 to a West Norfolk 'Planning for the Future' Small Business Grants programme to be delivered in partnership with New Anglia Local Enterprise Partnership.

Updated guidance from government on 22 March 2021 advised that a top up allocation would be awarded if the existing allocation was spent by 30 June 2021 (subsequently extended to 30 July 2021). Following the successful distribution of the allocation through a combination of discretionary grants and wider business support grant programmes, the Council secured the top up allocated, to be spent by 31st March 2022.

This phase of the ARG will be administered under the direction of the Regeneration Programmes Manager rather than by Revenues and Benefits section.

#### Reasons for the Decision

To agree the policy for wider business support from the existing ARG allocation to support businesses from the impacts of Covid-19.

To ensure that the existing ARG allocation is spent by 30 March 2022.

#### **Options considered**

This policy sits alongside the other funding support provided to businesses and provides for wider business support.
