Decision Taken

To utilise £1,000 of the West Norfolk Wins Borough Council funds to support the Bridge for Heroes 'Operation Mirror' project.

Reasons for the Decision

Bridge for Heroes would like to assist the local community, and in particular the most vulnerable members of the local Armed Forces community, in obtaining the vital supplies they need during the Covid-19 pandemic. The organisation has altered the use of their Bridge Centre into a centre for decontaminating and storing foodstuffs, as well as the preparation of hot meals in their kitchen.

These meals and other foodstuffs are delivered to the community members by Bridge for Heroes staff trained in PPE. The organisation is currently supporting approximately 150 vulnerable members of the Armed Forces community in this way.

They are also providing much needed mental health support during a time when the most vulnerable members of our society are feeling even more isolated and afraid.

Options considered

Funding could be awarded to other local businesses to assist with distribution of foodstuffs, but it would be extremely difficult, if not impossible, to truly identify those in need. Organisations may not be set up to be able to offer premises where foodstuffs can be assimilated, decontaminated and delivered from this base. Bridge for Heroes also has kitchen facilities within which to prepare a much needed hot meal.
