# 1. Temporary exhibitions and events at True's Yard Fisherfolk Museum

# 1.1 Exhibition Programme.

Our exhibition room has had a fresh coat of painting and the 2024 programme is underway. As we experience some staff turnover this winter and had to recruit a new Deputy Manager the decision was made to include an additional pre-made exhibition to give the Curator more time to work on the new exhibitions. # 4.2 YMCA Leicester and Norfolk Museum Service, Your Heritage, Your Future

The Museum continues to participate in the 'Your Heritage Your Future. Shannon has now been with the Museum since December and is enjoying her placement with us. Recently she designed and ran an activity at our Funfair Themed Family Day and suggested the prizes for the day. ## 4.3 Heritage Learning Forum

The Heritage Learning Forum has representatives from Stories of Lynn, King's Lynn Town Guides, Community Action Norfolk, Lynn Festival, King's Lynn Library, Marriott's Warehouse, Lynn Museum; Voluntary Norfolk, St George's Guildhall Complex, COWA, Volunteering Matters, King's Lynn Minster and St Nicholas' Chapel. This group meets quarterly to discuss various aspects of heritage organisations such as volunteers, school visits etc. The collaborate project for 2024 is currently being planned.

#### 4.4 Chatterton House

The Museum has renewed our partnership with the mental health organisation offering coffee mornings every Tuesday.

# **5.Learning and Outreach**

#### 5.1. Half term Activities

#### Funfair Family Activity Day & Dungeons and Dragons for Kids

We had 160 attendees of our Fun Fair Themed Family Activity Day on Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> February and on Saturday 24<sup>th</sup> February we trialled our Dungeon and Dragons for Kids which proved to be a success (fully booked). The one-hour session focussed on

developing numeracy skills, encouraging teamwork and also utilised in game money so the children gained an understanding of rudimentary budgeting.



# 5.2 Easter Holidays and May Half Term

For Easter there will be an Easter Trail around the Museum and on 3<sup>rd</sup> April will be an Easter themed Children's Activity Day and 29<sup>th</sup> May will be our Half Term Family Activity Day.

# 5.3. Festival of Archaeology

We are taking part in the Festival of Archaeology (13<sup>th</sup> -28<sup>th</sup> July 2024) with Archaeology Days on 20<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> July. We will be working in collaboration with the Museum of London, West Norfolk and King's Lynn Archaeological Society, King's Lynn Under Siege and specialist archaeologists. There will be digging activities, talks and more.

# 5.4. Oral History Project- Capturing Memories


A new Oral History Committee has formed with the aim of reinvigorating a previous oral history project. The new project 'Capturing Memories' will focus on recording the memories of the last generation of Northenders and those of the people of Lynn.

#### 5.5 Social Media

Currently the Museum's Facebook page has 2.2k followers and Twitter/X has 1,428 followers. We have recently focussed on increasing our usage of Instagram and our followers are steadily increasing 420 Followers (last report 401).

## **6 Visitor Numbers**

The figures for 1<sup>st</sup> April 2023 to 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2024 were 10,266 (At last meeting in December 8,385). We are on target to exceed last year's visitor numbers of 11,250.



Our largest demographic of visitors to the Museum continues to be concessions (60+, blue light and students). This corresponds to the data we receive from Groupon where 70% of sales are to people 51+. We are planning to increase our schools offer to encourage more school visits. It had been difficult as for 2023 as we had periods without a Deputy Manager due to illness and staff turnover limited our availability for schools.

# 7 Resource Implications

Finance- Increasing costs of utilities, insurance, accountancy have proved challenging. Savings and income generation is a big part of the 2024/25 budget.

Property- None.

Staff- Tabitha Kaye stepped down as Deputy Manager in December 2023 and has been replaced by Gaynor Western (February 2024).
