### **1. Temporary exhibitions and events at True's Yard Fisherfolk Museum**

#### **1.1 Exhibition Programme.**

**Next Exhibition:** TY35 *Mother Knows Best*: The Hidden Stories of Women of the North End. To celebrate the Museum's 35<sup>th</sup> Anniversary we will be shining a light on some of the lesser-known stories of the North End.

#### **Summer Art Exhibition: Your Maritime Heritage**

As it is an anniversary year, we're working hard to put on an extra special annual art exhibition. This will be opened on 3<sup>rd</sup> July by the Museum's Patron Sir Richard Jewson. There will be some exceptional pieces of maritime art from private collections so a rare opportunity for the public to see them. The exhibition will run across July and August.

#### **1.2 True's Talks**

Our Spring programme launched on 5<sup>th</sup> February and will conclude 26<sup>th</sup> March. Subjects include the latest discoveries in the roof of Oxburgh Hall, Art and the Industrial Revolution, how exhibitions have evolved over time and more. 8 talks in total all by local speakers very popular with audiences 40+ each talk. ### **4. Partnerships**

#### **4.1 The Margery Kempe Trust**

The Margery Kempe Trust have invited True's Yard to host a stop on their upcoming town-wide literary trails: The Book of You (Adults) and Scribbles the Scribe's Story Quest (Children). This project is part of the Love Your Market Town initiative, funded by Norfolk County Council and the Borough Council of King's Lynn and West Norfolk. These self-directed literary trails aim to drive footfall back to King's Lynn high streets and celebrate our unique heritage as the birthplace of English life writing.

The Margery Kempe Trust are partnering with students from Anglia Ruskin University to co-design the booklet's copy. A student team from ARU will visit King's Lynn on February 23rd to gather inspiration for the prompts.

A spreadsheet has been created and now the new

server has arrived the oral histories can be added to Modes, which has not previously been possible due to limitations on disk space.
