Councillor Kemp provided information on the Parish Partnership Scheme and suggested that buildings at risk be added to the Work Programme.


Councillor Collop suggested that bus companies be invited to a future meeting to provide an update.

The Help Hub looks to help address customer's needs before their difficulties become unmanageable. It will assist individuals and families at the earliest stage possible. Services can include:



Parish Partnership Schemes – Proposal from Councillor Kemp

I would like to create a continuation of the Ferry Lane footpath from Willow-Tree Chase to Clockcase Lane, as requested by residents.

Residents requested a footpath in 2020, after an accident when a pedestrian was clipped by a car that was not exceeding the speed limit of 40mph.

The stretch of road is open countryside but the only route to Millennium Way from this side of the village but it is dangerous for pedestrians as cars do not see them until they are on top of them.

It is but an important link between villages to walk or go to the shops.

I undertook a street survey in 2020 and residents were 100% in favour.

They said the road is dangerous to walk along and there are few places to walk on West Lynn.

We should be encouraging walking and cycling to improve public health.
