Reasons for the Decision

An order restricting alcohol consumption known as a Designated Public Place Order (DPPO) has been in place in King's Lynn, Downham Market and Hunstanton since 2007 using powers under the Criminal Justice Act 2006. This power allowed the restriction to remain in place without expiry, this made amending or rescinding the DPPO extremely complex, costly and did not allow for other unacceptable behaviours types to be restricted within the DPPO.

The legislation relating to DPPO changed in 2014 when the section of the Criminal Justice Act 2006 relating to DPPO's was repealed and replaced with the Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014. This allowed Local Authorities to convert the existing DPPO's to a PSPO, create a Public Space Protection Order (PSPO) covering other behaviours and amend according to the behaviours and needs of the community in a simplified process.

The PSPO is very similar to the DPPO but has variable differences which includes limiting the order for a maximum period of 3years. After a period of 3years the order must be renewed, varied, or be allowed to expiry.

Initially the new legislation allowed a transitional period of 3years after which the order required conversion of a DPPO to a PSPO. This transition occurred in 2017 as a like for like order.

In 2020, the designated areas were increased to cover the majority of the three towns. The rationale for increasing the designated area was to tackle displacement of alcohol related disorder caused by the smaller DPPO zones and to provide protection to new and proposed housing developments.

A consultation process include statutory consultees and those affected by the restriction (the public) is required by the Local Authority when seeking a new or, when renewing a PSPO. This renewal consultation took place between the 1st August 2023 and the 31st August 2023. The public consultation and statutory consultees demonstrated support for the renewal of the PSPO.

Details of alternative options, if any, considered and rejected.

The PSPO provides additional powers for agencies to tackle alcohol related disorder and is a preventative order which often works in conjunction with other powers such as a direction to leave.

Without the PSPO, agencies have lose a key preventative tool in the toolkit in tackling alcohol related disorder. Without the PSPO the power to deal with behaviour would only be available once an offence has occurred and the behaviour has already caused harm to the community.

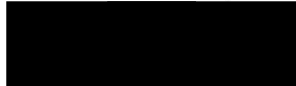

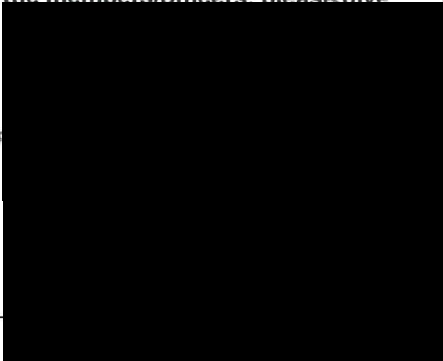
