Approval is sought, under the Scheme of Delegation, August 2024 (<u>https://democracy.west-norfolk.gov.uk/documents/s74368/Part%203%20SoD%20381864SchemeofDelegationAugust2</u>024.pdf) for the Borough Council's 2024/25 funding contribution to the Norfolk Coast National Landscape (Norfolk Coast Partnership).

The Norfolk Coast Partnership previously agreed, through the 2023 Norfolk Coast Partnership Memorandum of Agreement (MoA) Between Local Authority Funding Partners, the following Partners' indicative core funding contributions for the 2024-25 financial year:

- Norfolk County Council £32,872.18
- North Norfolk District Council £17,120.93
- Borough Council of Kings Lynn & West Norfolk £17,120.93
- Great Yarmouth Borough Council £1,369.67

These contributions were based on the indicative Defra core grant for 2024-25 (\pounds 182.164.57 with supplementary funding of \pounds 23,286.57), giving a total of \pounds 205,451.14 for the financial year.

The indicative Defra core grant for the 2024-25 financial year is now confirmed, at \pounds 182.164.57, with no further uplift. However, contrary to the 2023 MoA, the Borough Council's required 2024-25 contribution is reduced to \pounds 15,180.38.
