





Causes of homelessness









- Most often disengaged




New Legislation

- Fall in main housing duty numbers
- Invested heavily in software to deal with PHP and H-Clic




Figure 1 Areas of Norfolk in the 10% most deprived areas nationally (IMD 2010, DCLG)

Strategic Actions


- Development policies to support investment in Affordable housing/ PRS/ entry level and shared ownership
