
Authority Monitoring Report Requirements

Purpose is to inform the public/stakeholders

Based upon the financial year & should be published annually

Must Contain:

- Progress made against the LDS
- Duty to Cooperate Activity
- Dwelling Completions
- Collected monitoring information (for policies)
- Plus CIL, Neighbourhood Plans, unimplemented plan policies





AMR - Economy

- Plenty of space remaining in the SADMP Employment Allocations
- Employment Levels have remained broadly the same
- Weekly earnings have risen
- No planning permissions granted contrary to policies





AMR - Society

- A further 342 dwellings completed in 2018/19 and 591 dwellings completed in 2019/20
- A significant proportion (in the region of 30% +) of these took place on previously developed land/brownfield land
- The Borough Council prepared, had agreed, and published a Housing Delivery Test Action Plan and Update
- A healthy five-year supply position is able to be demonstrated





AMR - Environment

- 1 permission approved against EA advice
- New Strategic Flood Risk Assessment (SFRA) Level 1 & 2 studies introduced and are vital for planning decisions
- Two Air Quality Areas remain for monitoring purposes, although overall air quality across the borough has remained generally good
- Overview of historic environment
