#### Awards over £5,000:

#### **Denver Playing Field Association**

Funding is requested to improve the car park area at the playing field by laying a tarmac surface and replacing the current fencing and lighting. The work will create 75 car parking spaces which is greater than those currently available. The car parking area is currently a grass surface with no marked spaces, which is troublesome in winter as it often turns muddy, with vehicles getting stuck.

The field is used 50 weeks of the year and the group explain that the clubs who regularly use the space – particularly the football and crickets clubs – are seeing increasing numbers of club members which increases demand for suitable and safe parking, particularly on Saturdays.

 $\pounds$ 6,750 is requested towards a total cost of  $\pounds$ 25,208 to lay a new car parking surface at the playing field, complete with lighting and fencing. The remainder needed has been raised from various sources.

#### Decision: To award £6,750.00

## The Big C

The Big C explain that they urgently need to refurbish their new Support & Information Centre in King's Lynn so that they can safely re-open to local people affected by cancer. Closed since March 2020, their former Centre offered a full range of services free of charge, including counselling, support groups, 1:1 specialist registered nurses, bereavement and palliative care support, welfare rights advice, individually tailored health and fitness programmes and a resource centre.

However, the premises were no longer compliant with increased measures in Infection Control and Prevention implemented in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. The space was split over two poorly ventilated floors and they were unable to safely provide private one-to-one consultations or in-person support groups. A new location has been secured in the heart of King's Lynn on Railway Road. Necessary adaptations to the premises will include a suspended ceiling, air conditioning, kitchen units, fixtures and fittings.

A grant of £9,209 is requested towards a total project cost of £68,213. The remaining costs are in place.
