The Committee considered the comments from the Ombudsman and cross checked against the final version of the track changes policy.

The following amendments were agreed by the Committee:

Section 5 Appeals Procedure

Paragraph 1 be amended to read:

A complainant can appeal a decision to invoke this policy against them by submitting their request in writing to the Chief Executive within 12 months of the 'Decision.'

Paragraph 4 be amended to read:

There shall be only one opportunity to appeal each separate Decision, unless a relevant .reason is submitted by the complainant to justify another appeal. Relevant to be determined by the Chair, Vice Chair and one other member of the Standards Committee.

Paragraph 5 be amended to read:

Additionally, an appeal may also be reasonably requested under this section where relevant new evidence is submitted by the complainant. Relevance to be determined by the Chair, Vice Chair and one other member of the Standards Committee

Paragraph 7 be amended to read:

Upon an appeal request being accepted, the complainant will be sent a copy of the appeal hearing procedure which will set out the date by which their representations must be submitted and the date of the hearing.

If not accepted, the complainant will be sent a copy of the reasoning with information on how to complain to the Local Government and Social Care Ombudsman.

RESOLVED: The Monitoring Officer to incorporate the amendments set out above into the current policy and send a revised track changes document to the Informal Working Group prior to being considered by the Corporate Performance Panel on 4 January 2023 and Cabinet on 17 January 2023.
