TRUE'S YARD FISHERFOLK MUSEUM REPORT

Report by Museum Curator

1. Temporary exhibitions and events at True's Yard Fisherfolk Museum

1.1 Exhibition Programme.

As mentioned in my previous report we decided to change up our exhibition schedule and produce a new exhibition, which might be more appealing to general audiences. *The History of Fish and Chips* has garnered considerable interest and featured on BBC News Online. We have seen an increase of approximately 500 visitors compared to this time last year.

1.2 Summer Art Exhibition

Our annual art exhibition theme for 2024 was *Nostalgia...King's Lynn Through Time*. The High Sheriff of Norfolk, David Flux, opened the exhibition on 5th July. It featured 21 brand new pieces by local artist, Alan Castleton inspired by photographs from the town's past. So far we have had 1,793 attendees with still two weeks of the exhibition to go. Alan has also been incredibly generous, two paintings have been offered to the Museum as a donation and 10% of each sale of the remaining paintings will be donated to the Museum.

1.3 True's Talks

Our autumn programme has now been launched. All talks will take place on Thursdays between 26th September to 14th November between 1pm-2pm. They are free to attend.

3.2. Gloucester 1682 Talk

On Friday 13th September at 6:30pm, The Worshipful Mayor of the Borough of King's Lynn and West Norfolk, Paul Bland, will be hosting an evening charting the history and the future of the Gloucester, a royal ship carrying the Duke of York, which ran aground off the Norfolk coast in 1682.

Two of the team who discovered the Gloucester, Julian and Lincoln Barnwell, along with Professor Claire Jowitt from the University of East Anglia will be speaking at the event. Together, they will deliver a highly interesting and informative presentation, before the evening's guests enjoy a convivial supper in the Assembly Room.

The event offers the opportunity for first-hand insights from the team who are intimately involved in what has been described as 'Norfolk's Mary Rose'- a key part of our county's strong maritime heritage.

3.2 Friends of True's Yard

We are most fortunate to have the support of the Friends, they are a vital part of the Museum community and their fundraising events this year continue to sell out quickly.

4. Partnerships

4.1 The Festival of Archaeology

The Festival of Archaeology was a roaring success where we collaborated with the Museum of London, King's Lynn Under Siege and West Norfolk and King's Lynn Archaeological Society. It will definitely be repeated next year.

5.1. Summer Holiday Activities

Slime and Bubbles & Victorian Fairground Activity Days

13th August - Slime and Bubbles – this activity proved to be incredibly popular with 81 children and 65 adults. In future, we will be having designated slots for these activities as demand outstripped supply at one point.

27th August- Victorian Summer funfair - 83 attendees.



5.2 Oral History Project- Capturing Memories

Our new Oral History Committee is hard at work capturing new oral histories and so far 10 new stories have been recorded (last report 5). The new project 'Capturing Memories' will focus on recording the memories of the last generation of Northenders and those of the people of Lynn.

Currently the Museum's Facebook page has 2.3k followers; Twitter/X has 1,443 followers, and Instagram 461 Followers (last report 439).

Figures for 1^{st} April 2024 – mid August 2024 = 4,703.

Finance- Increasing costs of utilities, insurance, accountancy have proved challenging. Savings and income generation is a big part of the 2024/25 budget.

Staff- Curator 2 days a week, Deputy Manager 3 days a week, Museum Assistant 2 days a

week.
