The Norfolk Coast Partnership previously agreed, through the 2023 Norfolk Coast Partnership Memorandum of Agreement (MoA) Between Local Authority Funding Partners, the following Partners' indicative core funding contributions for the 2024-25 financial year:

 North Norfolk District Council
 Borough Council of Kings Lynn & West Norfolk

These contributions were based on the indicative Defra core grant for 2024-25 (£182.164.57 with supplementary funding of £23,286.57), giving a total of £205,451.14 for the financial year.

The indicative Defra core grant for the 2024-25 financial year is now confirmed, at £182.164.57, with no further uplift. However, contrary to the 2023 MoA, the Borough Council's required 2024-25 contribution is reduced to £15,180.38.

### Recommendation

Approval by the Acting Director for Environment and Planning, for payment of the Borough Council's £15,180.38 financial contribution to the Norfolk Coast National Landscape, for the

2024-25 financial year.

## **Reasons for the Decision**

The Borough Council remains a committed partner for the Norfolk Coast National Landscape, as agreed through the 2023 Norfolk Coast Partnership Memorandum of Agreement (MoA) Between Local Authority Funding Partners. This is reflected in the corporate priority to "Protect our environment – To create a cleaner, greener and better protected West Norfolk" (Corporate Strategy, 2023-2027).
